Grants open doors to mission opportunities

"On Mission Together" - it's been the theme for N.C. Baptists for a couple of years and rightly so since every church should be on mission. But what happens when God calls a church to a task that seems too big or too costly? That's often where the "Together" comes in as SMBA churches collaborate to help make the lift lighter or seek outside funding.

In late 2023, the SMBA introduced **Mission Opportunity Grants** to help churches fill gaps in their mission budgets. The grants are funded in part from donations to Baptists on Mission. Supported almost solely by the North Carolina Missions Offering, BOM sends 10 percent of that offering to local associations for missions.

"Our goal with the grants is to help congregations that have ide-

as for outreach but need extra funding to make it happen," says Andy Prince, SMBA AMS.

Since the program's inception, the SMBA has awarded more than \$10,100 in grants. Checks, ranging from \$300 to \$2,000, have helped pay for supplies for mission trips to Guatemala, Ecuador and the Dominican Republic and have also helped provide ramps for numerous local residents and to mail copies of the gospels to thousands more. The Missions Team, made up of eight SMBA pastors, reviews and votes on grant applications.
